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Printmaking by Scott Stephens will be on exhibit at Kennedy-Douglass Center for the Arts in Florence from March 10 through April 30. Stephens is a printmaker and a Professor of Art at the University of Montevallo. The exhibit features his work selected from the past ten years. It includes a full range of print processes and techniques, from traditional woodcuts and lithography to photo-etching and collagraphs.

Stephens' subject matter moves from abstraction to representation and is concerned with nature, process and perception. "I enjoy working in a large scale," Stephens said, "and pursue both the painterly and the photographic within the print format."

His work has been shown in numerous solo and group exhibitions at venues across the country including the Alabama Artists Gallery in Montgomery, the Mobile Museum of Art, the Huntsville Museum of Art, the Birmingham Museum of Art, and sites in Georgia, Ohio, Mississippi, and Florida. He received an Individual Artists Fellowship in 1992 and 2000 from the Alabama State Council on the Arts and has been a visiting artist and an artist-in-residence at facilities in Belgium, Canada, France, and Colorado. In 1986 he was awarded the Southern Arts Federation / National Endowment for the Arts Regional Emerging Visual Artists Fellowship in printmaking.

Stephens received a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Washington University and a Master of Fine Arts from the University of Alabama. He has taught at the University of Montevallo since 1983.
